GENERAL INFORMATION/PROVISIONS

The Thailand – United States Educational Foundation (TUSEF/Fulbright Thailand) is pleased to invite applications from Thai mid-career professionals<sup>1</sup> in government or private sectors who have demonstrated strong leadership in public services. Selected individuals will participate in the Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program for 10–12 months of non-degree academic study and professional experience in the United States. For the 2026 academic year, the Foundation will nominate **up to three (3)** outstanding candidates for final review and selection by the Institute of International Education (IIE) and U.S. Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs.

The Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program, part of the Fulbright exchange, strengthens leadership and U.S. ties among mid-career leaders from priority countries through academic and practical experiences in the U.S. Using a cohort model, Fellows are grouped by field at U.S. universities, where they gain leadership and policy skills through customized coursework and affiliations with U.S. organizations, supporting U.S. foreign policy goals. Humphrey Fellows work in critical fields, laying the groundwork for sustained engagement with U.S. partner countries to make the U.S. stronger, safer, and more prosperous.

PROGRAM FIELDS:

The program fields of study are grouped in four categories:

PROGRAM COMPONENTS:

a) Non-Degree Academic Study:

Humphrey Fellows pursue intensive study programs at participating U.S. host institutions. Approximately 11 U.S. campuses will be selected through a competitive process based on their ability to offer institutional and professional resources for cohorts of Fellows in designated fields of study. Humphrey Fellows may not request placement at any particular university. Each campus has at least one designated faculty coordinator for academic and administrative support. In addition, faculty advisors assist Fellows in pursuing balanced academic and professional programs.

<sup>1</sup> For hearing-impaired applicants who are selected for interviews, the Foundation will provide a sign language interpreter.

<sup>2</sup> Individuals in the finance field whose primary focus is on expanding a corporate entity's market share are not considered suitable candidates for the Humphrey Fellowship Program. Additionally, their home institution may be required to share the cost of the fellowship.



#### **b) Leadership and Professional Development:**

Professional enrichment activities include visits to relevant industries, think tanks, and professional organizations; skills-building workshops; conferences; and a professional affiliation placement. The professional affiliation provides firsthand exposure to a U.S. work environment on a full-time basis for a minimum period of six weeks.

#### **FINANCIAL and VISA PROVISIONS:**

The Humphrey Fellowship provides a monthly maintenance allowance, a book and supplies allowance, tuition and fees when applicable, round-trip international travel to the host institution (and to the Fellow's English-language training program when applicable) and domestic travel to Washington, D.C. for a special seminar. Supplementary funds are provided for professional activities such as field trips or attendance at conferences. **Humphrey Fellowships are not renewable.** The monthly maintenance allowance is based on the cost of living in a given area of the United States. There will be no provision for dependents to accompany fellows, nor will fellows receive a separate allowance to support dependents.

The Fulbright Program requires grantees to return to their home countries when their academic exchange activities in the United States are concluded. Grantees holding a J-1 visa are required to return and reside in Thailand for a minimum of two years before applying for non-immigrant visas (H and L) as temporary workers, for permanent residence in the United States, or as immigrants.

#### **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:**

- be a Thai citizen in good health aged no more than 55 years at the time of application; individuals with dual U.S. citizenship or U.S. permanent resident status are not eligible;
- be a Thai resident for at least one year prior to the application closing date and be physically present in Thailand at the time of interview;
- hold a Thai undergraduate degree from an accredited university in Thailand;
- Applicants with more than six months of non-degree experience in the United States must have returned to Thailand for at least **five years** prior to the application closing date. Applicants with a U.S. graduate degree must have returned to Thailand at least **seven years** prior to the application closing date;
- have a minimum of 5 years of full-time professional, management or policy-focused experience acquired after completing an undergraduate degree (by the application close date) in the relevant field; applicants whose experience is limited to teaching or research are not eligible to apply;
- have a valid English proficiency score taken within the past two years —TOEFL iBT (minimum 71) or IELTS Academic (minimum 6.0)— to be nominated.

#### **OTHER CRITERIA:**

- have a commitment to public service and the potential for professional advancement and outstanding record of professional accomplishments and leadership qualities;
- be able to fully participate in every activity organized by the Foundation, e.g. Pre-departure Orientation Program which will be held in June 2025;
- be currently employed with assurances of reemployment upon return;

## APPLICATION PROCEDURE AND REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Each applicant must create an online account and complete an online application on the website <https://apply.iie.org/hubertthumphrey> and submit the following documents online by the deadline:

1. An **online application** (complete answers to all questions in English through online application by **July 25, 2025**).
2. **Two letters of Recommendations**; one must be from the applicant's current employer. Through the online system, once you register your recommenders, they will receive an automatic email with instructions on completing the online recommendations, send reminders, and add/delete recommenders. Recommendation letters must be submitted within the deadline of application.
3. Scanned copies of transcripts and diplomas for all degrees obtained.
4. A scanned copy of a valid TOEFL iBT (minimum 71) or IELTS Academic (minimum 6.0) score report—taken within the past two years. If a valid score is not yet available, please submit any English proficiency score report, even if outdated, along with your anticipated TOEFL iBT or IELTS test date.

**All submissions must be in PDF format. A hard copy submission is not required.**

The deadline for submitting the complete online application and relevant documents is **July 25, 2025, at 11:59 p.m. (Thailand local time)**, to be eligible for consideration.
